You are hereby directed to appear in the Court of Hon'ble Ms.Saumya Chauhan, MM Tis Hazari Court, Room No.341, to give your consent for polygraph test (Lie Detector Test) on 8.11.2017 at 2.00 pm.’

4. Since petitioners have been served with a notice directing them to appear in the Court to give their consent for polygraph test, it is for them to respond to the notice and either to express their willingness to undergo the test or to refuse for the same.
5. No direction is required to be issued by this Court in exercise of writ jurisdiction.
6. The writ petition is dismissed.
