The learned counsel for the petitioner submits that
the petitioner would be satisfied in case he is granted a liberty to
file representation before the respondent no.4 and the respondent
no.4 may be directed to dispose of the representation of the
petitioner within a specified time frame.

Accordingly, it is directed that the petitioner shall file
a composite representation before the respondent no.4 regarding
his grievances raised in the writ petition within a period of two



weeks from today and the respondent no.4 is directed to dispose of the same within a period of four weeks thereafter, considering the order dated 11.4.2016 passed by a Division Bench of this Court in LPA No. 1190 of 2013.

The consequential benefits, if any, be granted to the petitioner within a period of four weeks of the passing of the final order.

The writ petition is disposed of on the aforesaid terms.
