Heard.

The learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner would be satisfied in case he is granted a liberty to file representation before the respondent no.4 and the respondent no.4 may be directed to dispose of the representation of the petitioner within a specified time frame.

Accordingly, it is directed that the petitioner shall file a composite representation before the respondent no.4 regarding his grievances raised in the writ petition within a period of two weeks from today and the respondent no.4 is directed to dispose of



the same within a period of four weeks thereafter. However, in the facts and circumstances of the present case, considering the delay and laches on the part of the petitioner, I further direct that the order passed by the aforesaid respondent no.4 shall be final and would not be amenable to challenge in a writ jurisdiction under Articles 226 and 227 of the Constitution of India.

The writ petition is disposed of on the aforesaid terms.
