2 03-08-2018 Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and learned
counsel for the State.

The petitioners are apprehending their arrest in a case
for the offence registered under Sections 272, 273 of the IPC,
30(a) and 37(b) of the Bihar Prohibition and Excise Act, 2016.

The prosecution story, in brief, is that total 840 ML
wine is said to have been recovered.

It has been submitted by learned counsel for the
petitioners that the petitioners have got no criminal antecedent.
There is no allegation of tampering with the witnesses alleged
against the petitioners. The petitioners have falsely been
implicated in the present case. It is alleged that total 840 ML wine
is recovered from joint house of the petitioners. The name of the



petitioners has come in the present case on the basis of alleged recovery made from joint house of the petitioners where other family members also reside. Except for this, there is no other substantive evidence to suggest the implication of the petitioners in this case. Nothing incriminating has been recovered from the conscious possession of the petitioners. The petitioners had no knowledge regarding the alleged incident. There is no compliance of Section 100 Cr. P.C.

On behalf of the State, it is submitted that the petitioners are named in the F.I.R/ Complaint Case.

Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances, let the petitioners above named, in the event of arrest or surrender before the learned court below within a period of six weeks from today, be released on anticipatory bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.10,000/- (Ten Thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned Additional Sessions Judge-IV-cum-Special Judge, Darbhanga, in connection with G.O. Case No. 1333 of 2017, arising out of Jamalpur P.S. Case No. 78 of 2017, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
