ORAL ORDER

3 08-02-2018 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned APP for
the State.

Petitioner apprehends her arrest in Bishambharpur P.S. case
no. 114 of 2017 instituted for the offence under Section(s) 304B and
201/34 of the Indian Penal Code.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner is
mother-in-law of the deceased. It is further submitted that husband
and father-in-law of the deceased are already in custody.

On notice, counsel for the informant has appeared and
opposed the prayer. There is allegation against this petitioner also
that she has tortured the deceased for demand of dowry.

From the written report itself, it appears that there is general
and omnibus allegation against this petitioner.

In the facts and circumstances of the case, prayer of the



petitioner for grant of anticipatory bail is allowed. In the event of surrender/arrest of the petitioner, named above, within six weeks from today in connection with Bishambharpur P.S. case no. 114 of 2017, she shall be released on anticipatory bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate-X, Gopalganj, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) Cr. P. C. with further conditions:(1) bailors should be local having sufficient immovable property within the jurisdiction of the court concerned, (2) petitioner shall cooperate in the trial and shall be present on each and every date fixed by the court and absence on two consecutive dates without proper and reasonable reason will automatically cancel bail bond of the petitioner and (3) if petitioner tampers with the evidence or the witnesses of the case, in that case, prosecution will be at liberty to move for cancellation of bail of the petitioner.
