analogous hearing along with LPA No.1702 of 2017.

Challenging an order passed by the learned Writ Court
on 13.04.2015 in CWJC No.21720 of 2014, this appeal has



been filed by the petitioner-employee and challenging the same order passed, an LPA was filed by the State Government being LPA No.1702 of 2017 and various other cases.
