The present writ petition has been filed for the following reliefs:

“(i) Issuance of order, direction, writ for cancellation of licence or order for opening the Petrol Pump in between Mile Stone No. 69 to 71 situated at State Highway (S.H.) at Dewariya-Sahebganj way at right side of the road whose serial no. is 505.

(ii) Any other relief or reliefs the petitioner may be found to be entitled to in the facts and circumstances of the present case.”
