ORAL ORDER

Heard both sides.

The petitioners apprehend their arrest in Mokama P.S. case No. 154 of 2015 under Section 307 and other Sections of the Indian Penal Code and under Section 27 of the Arms Act.

The learned counsel for the petitioners submits that initially the case was registered under Section 307 and other Sections of IPC and under Section 27 of the Arms Act but police after investigation submitted charge sheet under bailable sections of the IPC even thereafter the learned Magistrate took cognizance under Section 307 of the IPC and under Section 27 of the Arms



Act. It is submitted that the case has been compromised but from perusal of paragraph 3 of the petition it appears that petitioners have got criminal antecedent.

Considering the facts aforesaid, I am not inclined to enlarge the petitioners on anticipatory bail. Accordingly, the same is rejected.

If the petitioners surrender in the court below, the learned court below shall consider the prayer for regular bail of the petitioners taking into consideration all these facts and pass order on the bail petition, preferably, on the same day.
