ORAL ORDER

2 09-02-2018 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned
counsel for the State.

The petitioner seeks pre-arrest bail in connection
with Rajnagar P.S. Case No. 173 of 2017 registered under
Sections 272, 273 read with 34 of the Indian Penal Code and
Section 30(a) of the Bihar Excise Prohibition Act, 2016.

Section 76(1) of the Bihar Prohibition and Excise
Act, 2016 stipulates that all offences under this Act shall be
cognizable and non-bailable. Its sub-section (2) stipulates that
section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure shall not apply to
the offences under the Excise Act.



Keeping in mind the allegations made in the F.I.R. and the statutory bar to grant of pre-arrest bail to those booked under the Bihar Prohibition and Excise Act, 2016, in my considered opinion, an application under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure in the present matter is not maintainable.

Thus, the petition is dismissed as not maintainable.

In case the petitioner surrenders and seeks bail, the learned Special Judge shall be required to dispose of the same on merits taking into consideration the observations made by this Court in the matter of **Ashok Sahani vs. State of Bihar [(2017) 3 PLJR 632]**.
