2 27-11-2018 Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and learned APP
for the State.

The petitioners are apprehending their arrest in a case registered under Sections 341, 323, 325, 504, 307/34 of the Indian Penal Code and 27 of the Arms Act.

The prosecution case, in brief, is that in the backdrop of land dispute, the dispute arose. It is alleged that while the informant was sitting at his door, the accused persons variously armed came there and assaulted the informant.

It has been submitted on behalf of the petitioners that the petitioners have got no criminal antecedent. There is no allegation of tampering of witnesses alleged against the petitioners. The petitioners have been falsely implicated in the



present case. As per injury report, the nature of injury is said to be simple. No offence u/S 307 of the Indian Penal Code is made out. Rest of the offences are triable by the Magistrate.

On behalf of the State, it is submitted that the petitioners are named in the Complaint Case/F.I.R.

Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances, let the petitioners, above named, in the event of arrest/surrender before the learned court below within a period of six weeks from today, be released on anticipatory bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.10,000/- (Ten thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Bikramganj, Rohtas in connection with Natwar P.S. Case No. 61 of 2018, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
