2. Though the writ petition is not clearly framed but from the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner, it transpires that he was an employee of Bihar State Co-operative Marketing Union (hereinafter referred to as the 'BISCOMAUN').

3. As it has been settled by a Special Bench of this Court in the case of **The Organizer, Dehri C.D. & C.M. Union Limited vs. State of Bihar and others** reported as **2014(1) PLJR 695** that writ petition against a Co-operative Society is not maintainable and BISCOMAUN being a Co-operative Society



functioning under an elected Managing Committee, the present writ application clearly is not maintainable.

4. Accordingly, the writ petition stands disposed off with liberty to the petitioner to move before the appropriate forum in accordance with law including the Registrar, Co-operative Societies.
