Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the facts of
the present case are identical to the case of C.W.J.C. No. 10281 of



2016 (Dharmendra Kumar & Ors. Vs. The State of Bihar & Ors.),, the aforesaid judgment squarely covers the issue involved in the present case.

In such view of the matter, the concerned authority is directed to examine the facts, law and prayer of the case of petitioners and if it is found that present case is squarely covered by the aforesaid cases, the same benefit should also be extended to the petitioners.
