case of the petitioner squarely covered by a judgment reported in  
  
2018(3) PLJR 1029 (Judgment dated 17.07.2018 passed in CWJC  
  
No. 17670 of 2017).

In view of the aforesaid submissions made by the  
  
learned counsel for the petitioner, I deem it fit and proper to grant  
  
liberty to the petitioner to file a detailed representation before the
