Learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that goods of the petitioner have been seized by respondent No.1 without authority of law and without following the provisions of the Street Vendors (Protection of Livelihood and Regulation of Street Vending) Act, 2014 (hereinafter called as "the Act of 2014").
2. On the other hand, learned counsel for respondent No.1 would submit that the petitioner will be given places for vending temporarily and in May, 2018 permanent places for vending will be given and goods seized shall be returned to her within 3 days from today.
3. In view of the aforesaid statement made by learned counsel for the Municipal Corporation, Raipur, the writ petition stands

disposed of. The Municipal Corporation, Raipur is directed to strictly follow the provisions of the Act of 2014 and necessary certificate will be issued in favour of the petitioner at the earliest.
