1. Learned Counsels appearing for the Petitioner as well as by the State Government jointly submit that the facts of the instant case stands squarely covered by a decision of this Court in W.P.(S). No. 6976 of 2009 titled as 'Hitendra Tanna & Others v. State of Chhattisgarh & Another' decided on 3.1.2018.
2. Given the submission by the learned State Counsel, the present writ petition also stands disposed of in similar terms as that of order dated 3.1.2018 passed in W.P.(S). No. 6976 of 2009 titled as 'Hitendra Tanna & Others v. State of Chhattisgarh & Another'.
