Hon'ble Shri Justice Sanjay K. Agrawal**Order on Board****14.06.2018**

1. This is an application filed under Section 439 of the Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail to the applicant, who has been arrested in connection with Crime No. 561 of 2016, registered at Police Station- Sarkanda, District- Bilaspur (CG), for the offence punishable under Sections 354, 506 of the IPC.

2. Case of the prosecution, in brief, is that the applicant outraged modesty of the complainant and threatened her also, thereby, committed the offence.

3. Learned counsel for the applicant would submit that the applicant has not committed the offence and he has falsely been implicated in the crime in question. Charge-sheet has been filed. He is

in custody since 20.03.2018. No useful purpose would be served by keeping him in jail.

4. On the other hand, learned counsel for the State opposes the bail application.

5. I have heard counsel appearing for the parties and perused the case diary.

6. Taking into consideration the facts and circumstances of the case, nature and gravity of the offence, pre-trial detention since 20.03.2018, I am of the opinion that present is a fit case for grant of regular bail.

7. Accordingly, the bail application filed under Section 439 of the Cr.P.C. is allowed.

8. It is directed that the applicant shall be released on bail on his furnishing a personal bond in the sum of **Rs.25,000/-** with one surety in the like sum to the satisfaction of the concerned Court for his appearance as and when directed.
