3 In our considered view, it is not the case of the petitioner that the respondent has committed breach or willful disobedience of the court order. However, that may not give rise for action for civil contempt under Contempt of Courts Act. We therefore, do not want to proceed further. Hence, Contempt Petition is dismissed.
