The above Civil Application has been filed for condonation of delay of 223 days and for restoration of the PIL which has been dismissed for non prosecution on the ground of non removal of office objections.

2 Having regard to the fact that PIL has been dismissed for a technical reason, we deem it appropriate to grant one more opportunity to the petitioner to prosecute the PIL on merits.

3 Civil Application is accordingly allowed. Resultantly, PIL is restored to file. Office objections if not already removed, the same be removed within 2 weeks from date.
