2 Heard learned Counsel for the parties. The matter is mentioned for extension of time to comply with the condition of deposit passed on the summons for judgment. In the first matter, i.e. Summons for Judgement No.69 of 2016, the Defendant was put to the condition of deposit a sum of Rs.64,68,830/- within six weeks. Learned Counsel for the Defendant states

that time expires tomorrow and about Rs.33,00,000/- that is to say, a little over 50 per cent of the amount is being deposited in the court during the course of the day.
