1. Ms.Singhania, learned counsel appearing for the petitioner states that both the respondents are served. None appeared for the respondent no.1.
2. By this petition filed under section 29-A of the Arbitration & Conciliation Act, 1996, the petitioner seeks extension of time to enable the learned arbitrator to render an award. 18 months period has already expired on 23rd December, 2017. Learned counsel for the respondent no.2 has no objection if the extension as prayed by the petitioner is granted. The matter is at the evidence stage.
3. Learned arbitrator is granted 12 months time to render an
