2 The learned counsel for the respondent states that the entire arrears are transferred in the bank account of the petitioner – 1. The learned counsel for the petitioner – 1 does not dispute the statement.

3 The learned counsel for the respondent Smt. Dharmadhikari further states that the respondent has instructed his banker to transfer Rs. 20,000/- to the bank account of the petitioner – 1 out of which Rs. 10,000/- is towards payment of arrears. Now, that the entire arrears are paid, the amount of Rs. 10,000/- which was towards payment of arrears should be re-transferred by the petitioner to the account of the respondent, in the event the

respondent is not in a position to modify or revoke the instructions. The learned counsel for the petitioners Smt. Anjankar undertakes to re-transfer the extra amount, if received. In view of the payment of arrears, the learned counsel for the petitioners seeks liberty to withdraw the petition.

4 Needless to say, the payment is made by the respondent without prejudice to his right to challenge the substantive orders.

5 Petition is disposed of as withdrawn.
