ORDER

The petitioner has given a representation to the Director General of Police and thereafter, filed the present Writ Petition for a direction to the Director General of Police to consider and dispose of the petitioner's representation dated 21.09.2016.

2.For issuance of a Mandamus, there should be a statutory duty cast upon the public functionary to perform certain duties.

3.In these circumstances, this Court cannot direct the 1st respondent to consider the representation of the petitioner as the issue involved are purely civil in nature. Therefore, the petitioner is not entitled to get a Mandamus as sought for.

Hence, this Writ Petition is dismissed. No costs.

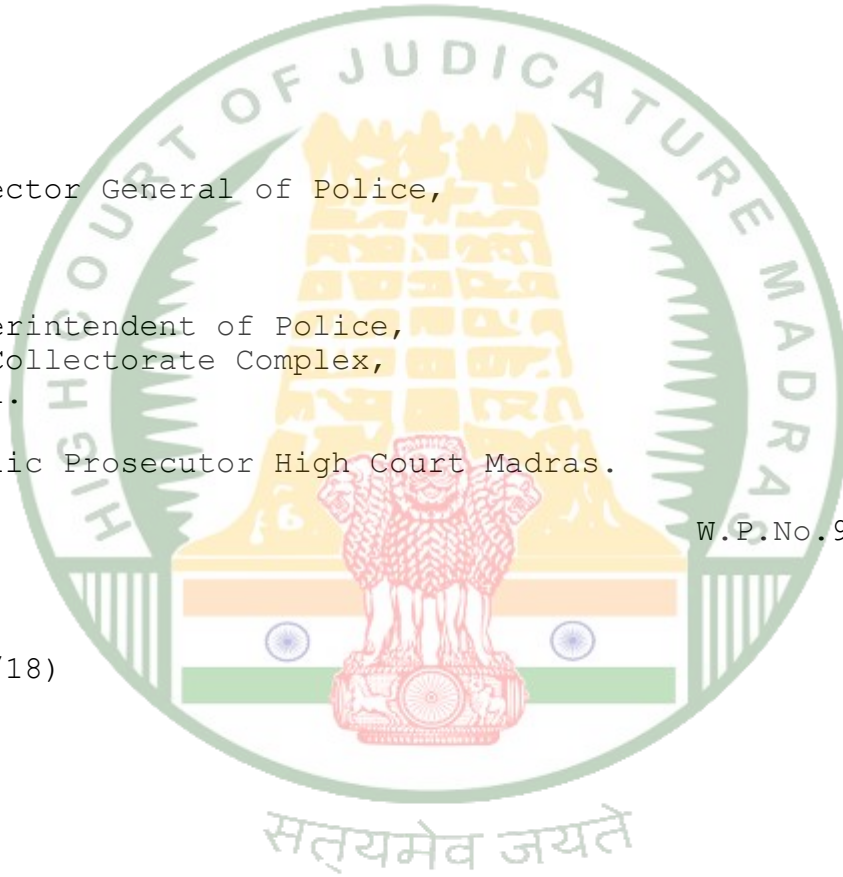
