PRAYER: Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, to issue a Writ of Habeas Corpus, calling for the entire records connected with the order of detention passed by the 2nd respondent herein concerned in No.BCDFGISSSV No.568/2018 dated 23.07.2018 and set aside the order of detention passed therein against the Detenu herein by name Suresh S/o. Raji, quash the same and setting him at liberty. Not detained central prison, puzhal.

ORDER

[Order of the Court was made by C.T.SELVAM, J.]

The petitioner, who is the father of the detenu, namely, Suresh, Son of Raji, aged 27 years, challenges the impugned order of detention, dated 23.07.2018 in BCDFGISSSV NO.568/2018 detaining his son as "GOONDA", as contemplated under Section 2 (f) of the Tamil Nadu Prevention of dangerous activities of Boot leggers, Drug Offenders, Forest Offenders, Goondas, Immoral Traffic Offenders, Sand Offenders, Slum-grabbers and Video Pirates Act, 1982 (Tamil Nadu Act 14/1982).

2. The detenu has come to adverse notice in the following cases:-

The ground case has been registered against the detenu in Crime No.127/2018 on the file of the Inspector of Police, S-4 Nandambakkam Police Station for offences u/s 341, 294(b), 323, 336, 392, 397 and 506(ii) IPC. The detention order has been passed by second respondent in BCDFGISSSV No.568/2018 on 23.07.2018.

3. We have heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and the learned Additional Public Prosecutor appearing for the respondents. We have also perused the records produced by the Detaining Authority.

4. Though several grounds have been raised in the Habeas Corpus Petition, the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner, confines his argument only in respect of non-application of mind on the part of the detaining authority in passing the order of detention.

5. The Grounds of Detention would reveal that 3 adverse cases have been registered against the detenu and a ground case was registered against him in Cr.No.127/2018 for the offences 341, 294(b), 323, 336, 392, 397 and 506(ii) IPC. Admittedly, the detenu has not moved any bail application in all the three adverse cases Crime Nos.351/2018, 40/2018 and 163/2018. Therefore, the probability of release of the detenu imminently does not arise. Hence, we are inclined to set aside the detention order. Though the detaining authority has made reliance on similar case, in which an accused was granted bail, the facts involved in those cases are different. The principle of similarity cannot be applied mechanically. Normally, bails are granted based on the facts and circumstances of each case. Therefore, similar case plea, cannot be taken into consideration. Hence, there is no material to substantiate that there is real possibility of the detenue coming out on bail

and the said order was passed without application of mind.

6. In the result, the Habeas Corpus Petition is allowed and the order of detention in BCDFGISSSV No.568/2018 dated 23.07.2018, passed by the second respondent is set aside. The detenu, namely, Suresh, Son of Raji, aged about 27 years, is directed to be released forthwith unless his detention is required in connection with any other case.
