Prayer : Writ Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, praying to issue a writ of mandamus directing the respondents 1 & 2 to fix the seniority on part with the 1st batch based on the marks secured by the petitioner in the police training college as per Rule by considering the representation of the petitioner dated 04.12.2017 within a reasonable time.

ORDER

Mrs.R.Janaki, learned Additional Government Pleader accepts notice for the respondents.

2. It appears that the petitioner was directly recruited as Sub-Inspector of police in the year 1997-1998. The grievance of the petitioner is that though the Government in G.O.No.116 dated 06.02.2017 had passed an order fixing the seniority of the persons who are the batch mates of the petitioner, but, the petitioner's seniority has not been fixed as per mandate of law. In this regard he has made a representation to the authority on 04.12.2017 i.e. to the first and second respondents to consider his case for fixation of seniority in accordance with law. Since, no orders have been passed till date, the petitioner has come forward with this Writ Petition seeking for the aforesaid relief.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner would submit that the respondents 1 and 2 may be directed to consider and dispose

of the representation of the petitioner dated 04.12.2017 as per law, within a stipulated period.

4. The learned Special Government Pleader appearing for the respondents, has stated that the respondents shall have no objection to dispose of the representation of the petitioner dated 04.12.2017, if the same is pending but in accordance with law.

5. Hence regard being had to the facts and circumstances of the case and also the submissions made, this Court disposes of this writ petition with a direction to the respondents 1 and 2 to consider and dispose of the representation of the petitioner dated 04.12.2017, if the same is pending, on merits and in accordance with law, within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, if there is no other legal impediment and communicate the decision taken to the petitioner. However, it is made clear that this Court has expressed no opinion on the merits of the representation. There shall be no order as to costs..
