COMMON O R D E R

(Order of the Court was delivered by M.M. Sundresh, J.)

Seeking issuance of community certificate, as if, the petitioners and their respective children belong to Kattunayakan Community, which is a Scheduled Tribe Community, the petitioners herein have made applications on 21.10.2018 and 01.11.2018. Since the said applications evoked no response, they have come

forward to file the Writ Petitions seeking appropriate direction upon the respondent to issue the community certificate.

2. The learned counsel appearing for the petitioners submits that though the petitioners have sought for such a larger relief, it would be suffice if the pending applications are directed to be disposed of by the respondent in a time bound manner.

3. The learned Special Government Pleader for the respondent submits that the respondent has no objection to consider and pass orders on the applications filed by the petitioners but in accordance with law.

4. Considering the limited scope of the relief now sought for by the learned counsel appearing for the petitioners at the time of admission, we deem it appropriate to dispose of this Writ Petition with a direction to the respondent to consider the applications filed by the petitioners on 21.10.2018 and 01.11.2018 and pass appropriate orders within a period of six weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.

5. Accordingly, the Writ Petition stands disposed of No costs.
