Prayer: Petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, to issue a writ of Mandamus, to direct the first respondent to release the petitioner's vehicle of JCB, bearing Registration No.TN-67-AJ-4833 from the custody of the second respondent's police and to hand over the above vehicle to the petitioner by considering the petitioner's representation, dated 10.10.2018.

ORDER

This writ petition has been filed seeking a writ of Mandamus, to direct the first respondent to release the petitioner's vehicle of JCB, bearing Registration No.TN-67-AJ-4833 from the custody of the second respondent's police and to hand over the above vehicle to the petitioner by considering the petitioner's representation, dated 10.10.2018.

2. Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate appearing for the respondents.

3. According to the petitioner, the official respondent has seized the vehicle in question on the ground that it was involved in transportation of illegal sand without any valid permit and the vehicle is still under the police custody. Hence, this Writ Petition is filed.



4. On the other hand, it is submitted by the learned Government Advocate appearing for the respondents that the vehicle in question was used for illegal transportation of sand without any valid permit and hence, it was seized.

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5. In any event, as the vehicle is under the custody of the official respondent from the date of seizing and considering the fact that if the same is allowed to be kept idle by exposing the same to sun and rain, it would certainly diminish its value. Therefore, this Court is of the view that the vehicle may be released by imposing conditions on the petitioners for release of the same.

6. Accordingly, the concerned respondent is directed to release the vehicle in question to the petitioner within a period of 7 days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order subject to the following conditions:

"(i) The petitioner shall produce necessary documents before the concerned respondent to establish the ownership of the vehicle in question;

(ii) The petitioner shall deposit a sum of Rs.75,000/- (Rupees Seventy Five Thousand only), before the first respondent as non refundable deposit;

(iii) The petitioner shall give an undertaking that he will not use the vehicle for any illegal activities in future and shall produce the same as and when required by the respondents;

(iv) On doing so, the vehicle in question shall be returned to the petitioner;

(v) The petitioner shall not alienate the vehicle in question till the disposal of the proceedings before the authority concerned; and

(vi) The petitioner is also directed to participate in the enquiry to be conducted by the respondents."

However, it is made clear that if the vehicle involves in the crime for the second time, the concerned respondent shall not release the vehicle.

7. With the above direction, this Writ Petition is disposed of. No costs.
