PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

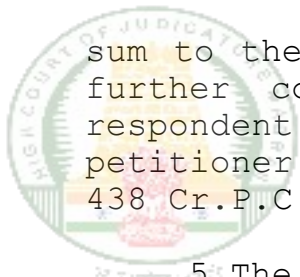
ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioner/ accused No.4 apprehends arrest at the hands of the Inspector of Police, Theni Police Station, Theni District for the offences punishable under Sections 465, 471 and 420 of IPC in Crime No.214 of 2018, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (Crl Side) appearing for the respondent.

3.The case of the defacto complainant is that one Alagumuthu suppressing the sale of the subject property in favour of Visvanathan, had created family settlement. The petitioner herein is one of the settles. The case against the petitioner and others rests only on documentary evidence. Therefore, custodial interrogation is not necessary in this case.

4.Considering the facts of this case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Theni District and on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties for a like



sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation. The petitioner shall comply with the conditions stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

5. The petitioner shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy is made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed.
