ORDER

By consent of both parties, the main Writ Petition itself is taken up for final disposal at the stage of admission.

2.Mr.K.Saravanan, learned Government Advocate, takes notice on behalf of the respondent.

3.The petitioner is employed as a Driver. The bus in which the petitioner was driving got involved in an accident on 08.03.2018. In this regard, Crime No.112 of 2018, was registered on the file of the Ambathurai Police Station. The petitioner's Driving License has also been seized by the respondent. The Criminal Court is yet to pronounce its verdict on the guilt or otherwise of the petitioner. Proceedings for impounding are yet to take place. This Court in the decision reported in **(2015) 2 CTC 626 -(R.Ravi Vs. The Regional Transport Officer, Transport Department)** held that such retaining of the original driving license is not permissible in law.

4.Therefore, the respondent is directed to return the petitioner's original Driving License immediately to the petitioner.



5.The Writ Petition is allowed accordingly. No costs.
