PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

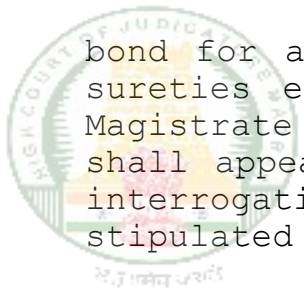
The petitioner/ accused No.1 apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 120(b), 406, 420, 465 and 468 IPC in Crime No.6 of 2018 and seeks anticipatory bail.

2.Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (Crl Side) appearing for the respondent.

3.This Court had earlier granted interim relief to the petitioner on condition that the petitioner should appear before the respondent.

4.The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) submits that the petitioner did not open his mouth. Be that as it may, the case against the petitioner rests on documentary evidence and that of the defacto complainant.

5.Therefore custodial interrogation is not required, this court is inclined to grant Anticipatory Bail to the petitioner with certain conditions. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Theni and on his executing a



bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation. The petitioner shall comply with the conditions stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

6. The petitioner shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy is made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed.
