PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioner apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences under Section 6(2), 6(3) and 6(4) of TNSC (RDCS) order 1982 r/w 7(1)(a)(ii) of E.C. Act, 1955, in Crime No.142 of 2017, and seeks anticipatory bail.

2. The allegation against the petitioner is that she was involved in transportation of 9 ½ tons of ration rice illegally.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution and she has been falsely implicated in this case. He further submitted that based on the confession of A4, A7 and A8, the petitioner is arrayed as Accused No.3.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Criminal side) submitted that the petitioner is involved in transporting 9½ tons of ration rice illegally and the property has been recovered.

5. Taking note of the above facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is inclined to grant the relief of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.



6. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on her appearance before the learned Magistrate concerned within a period of 10 days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, on executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate No.I, Virudhunagar District, or to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m. for two weeks and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation.
