PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioners apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences under Sections 120 (B), 147 and 285 IPC and Sections 3 and 4 of the Explosives Act, in Crime No.280 of 2018 and seek anticipatory bail.

2.The learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners have not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution and they have been falsely implicated in this case.

3.The learned Government Advocate (Criminal side) submitted that there was a wordy quarrel between the brother of the defacto complainant and the first petitioner, as a result of which, on 08.05.2018, at 9.30 hours, petrol bombs were thrown in front door of the defacto complainant. He further submitted that no one sustained injury in the occurrence.

4.Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is inclined to grant the relief of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.



5. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance before the learned Magistrate concerned within a period of 10 days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, on executing a separate bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate No.IV, Madurai, or to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer, who intends to arrest and on further condition that the petitioners shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m. for two weeks and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation.
