PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences under Sections 147, 148, 452, 294(b), 323, 353, 307 of IPC and Section 3 of TNPPDL Act, in Crime No.78 of 2018, seek anticipatory bail.

2. The case of the prosecution is that since there was an wordy altercation between two groups with regard to the election of Primary Agriculture Co-operative Credit Society, the respondent police registered a case against the petitioners.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent person and they have not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution. He further submitted that the petitioners have been falsely implicated in this case.

4. The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the State would submit that no one is injured in this case.

5. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and taking note of the fact that no one is injured in this case, this



Court is inclined to grant the relief of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

6. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance before the learned Magistrate concerned within a period of 10 days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, on their executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only) each, with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Peraiyur, or to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m for two weeks and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation.
