PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioners, who are arrayed as A1 & A2, apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences under Sections 406, 420, 147, 294(b), 355 and 506(i) IPC, in Crime No.1061 of 2016 and seek anticipatory bail.

2.The learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners have not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution and they have been falsely implicated in this case.

3.Learned Government Advocate (Crl.side) appearing for the State submitted the the first petitioner is doing real estate business and for developing his business, he borrowed a hand loan from the de-facto complainant. When the de-facto complainant asked the petitioner to repay the said amount, he refused to repay the same and also abused the de-facto complainant with filthy language.

4.Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and taking note of the fact that this case pertains to civil dispute,



this Court is inclined to grant the relief of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

5. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance before the learned Magistrate concerned within a period of 10 days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, on each of them executing a separate bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Melur, or to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer who intends to arrest and on further condition that the petitioners shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m for two weeks and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation.
