PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

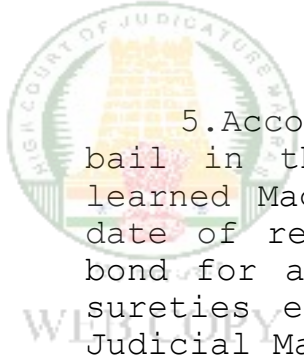
ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioners apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offences under Sections 294(b), 332, 353 and 506(i) IPC in Crime No.209 of 2018 and seek anticipatory bail.

2.The learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners have not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution and they have been falsely implicated in this case.

3.The learned Government Advocate (Criminal side) submitted that on 13.05.2018 while the defacto complainant was on duty in front of the Veerapandi Sri Mariamman Temple for bundobust purpose, the petitioners along with their driver Eswaran/A1 were about to get entry in the Temple main gate, which was resisted by the defacto complainant, as a result of which, a wordy quarrel arose between them and the petitioners abused the defacto complainant in filthy language and A1 threatened him with dire consequences.

4.Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is inclined to grant the relief of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.



5. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance before the learned Magistrate concerned within a period of 10 days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, on executing a separate bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate Theni, Theni District, or to the satisfaction of the respondent police or the police officer, who intends to arrest and on further condition that the petitioners shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m. for two weeks and thereafter, as and when required for interrogation.
