PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

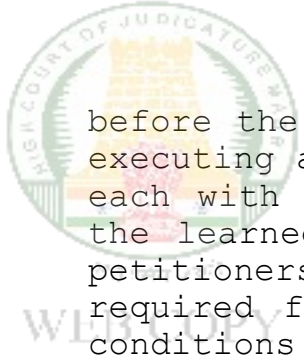
ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioners/Accused No.19 and 20 apprehending arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 406, 409, 467, 468, 471, 477(A) and 34 of IPC, in Crime No.5 of 2018, seek anticipatory bail.

2.Heard the learned counsel for the petitioners and the learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) for the respondent.

3.It is submitted by the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner that the petitioners are the members of Self Help Group and that they had borrowed a sum of Rs.2,00,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs) through a Mediator and that they had repaid the amount to the Mediator. But the same was not passed on to the lender. In these circumstances, the case came to be registered. Since the case is against the petitioners who are the members of the Self Help Group, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

4.Therefore, taking into account of these circumstances, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with certain conditions. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance



before the learned Judicial Magistrate No.III, Madurai and on their executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioners shall appear before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation. The petitioners shall comply with the conditions stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

5.The petitioners shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed.
