PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

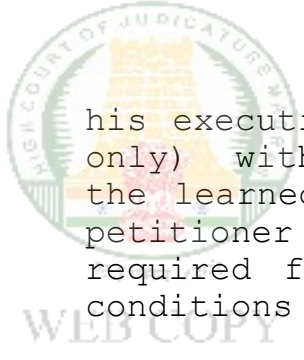
ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioner apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent Police for the offences under Sections 147, 148, 294(b), 323, 324 and 506(ii) I.P.C and Section 4 of TNPWH Act in Crime No.125 of 2018.

2.Heard the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner and the learned Government Advocate (Crl. side) appearing for the respondent.

3.The learned Government Advocate (Crl. side) opposes the grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner by pointing out that the *de facto* complainant is still in hospital. This Court went through the contents of the First Information Report. It is seen that the primary allegations are only against one Punniyamoorthis. The petitioner who is a senior citizen had attacked the victim only with a bare hands.

4.Hence, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Paramakudi and on



his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation. The petitioner shall comply with the conditions stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

5.The petitioner shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed.
