PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

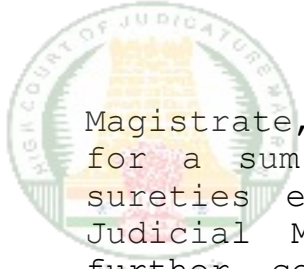
The petitioner, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the alleged offence punishable under Sections 294(b), 323, 324 and 506(ii) I.P.C, in Crime No.475 of 2018 on the file of the respondent police, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that there was a dispute arose between the petitioner and the defacto complainant with regard to the pathway, due to which, the petitioner along with others attacked the defacto complainant and caused injuries. Hence the complaint.

3. According to the petitioner, he is an innocent person and he has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution.

4.The learned Government Advocate [Criminal Side] appearing for the respondent submitted that the injured has been discharged from the hospital on 22.12.2018.

5.Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and also considering the fact that the dispute arose on account of wordy quarrel and the injured has been discharged from the hospital, this Court is inclined to grant Anticipatory Bail to the petitioner. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance before the learned Judicial



Magistrate, Melur, Madurai District and on their executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a likesum to the satisfaction of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Melur, Madurai District, concerned and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.30.am., until further orders. The petitioner shall comply with the conditions stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

6.The petitioner shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed.
