PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

The petitioners, who apprehend arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 147, 148, 294(b), 427, 324 and 506(ii) I.P.C. in Crime No.334 of 2018, seek anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that the accused persons were drinking alcohol near the church. When the same was questioned by the defacto complainant, they assaulted him and also threatened him with dire consequences. Hence, the complaint.



3.The learned counsel appearing for the petitioners would submit that the petitioners are innocents. They did not commit any offence as alleged by the prosecution. Hence, he prays for anticipatory bail.

4.The learned counsel for the intervener would submit that the petitioners and other accused persons, who were in an intoxicated condition, brutally attacked the defacto complainant and others. Due to that, they were severely injured. Hence, he vehemently opposed the grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

5.The learned Government Advocate (Crl.Side) appearing for the respondent submitted that injured had been discharged from the hospital.

6.Taking note of the facts and circumstances, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners with certain conditions. Accordingly, the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail in the event of arrest or on their appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Melur, Madurai District and on their executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) each with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioners shall appear before the respondent police as and when required for interrogation. The petitioners shall comply with the conditions stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

7.The petitioners shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed.
