He further submitted that there is no proposal to transfer the complaint and it is going to be enquired only by the second respondent.

3.In view of the categorical stand taken by the learned Government Advocate (Civil Side), this Court directs the second respondent to complete the enquiry within a period of two weeks from the date of receipt of a copy of this order.
