PETITION FOR ANTICIPATORY BAIL Under Sec. 438 Cr.P.C.

ORDER : The Court Made the following order :-

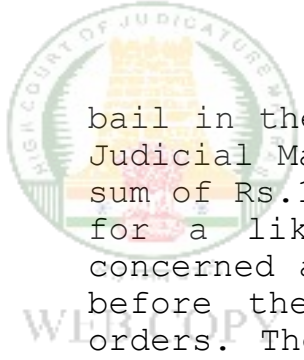
The petitioner/A2 apprehends arrest at the hands of the respondent police for the offences punishable under Sections 279, 337 and 379 of I.P.C., in Crime No.148 of 2018, seeks anticipatory bail.

2.The case of the prosecution is that on 08.09.2018, while the uncle of the defacto complainant was travelling on Aladiyur to Perungulam Road , the vehicle lorry bearing Registration No.TN 31 AZ 5844 dashed the defacto complainant's vehicle and he sustained injury and thereafter, he came to know that the said vehicle was involved in sand theft.

3.The learned counsel appearing for the petitioner would submit that the petitioner is an innocent person and he has not committed any offence as alleged by the prosecution.

4.The learned Government Advocate (criminal side) submitted that two persons were injured in the occurrence and no previous case as against the petitioner.

5.Taking note of the facts and circumstances, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner with certain conditions. Accordingly, the petitioner is ordered to be released on



bail in the event of arrest or on his appearance before the learned Judicial Magistrate, Srivaikuntam and on his executing a bond for a sum of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand only) with two sureties each for a like sum to the satisfaction of the learned Magistrate concerned and on further condition that the petitioner shall appear before the respondent police daily at 10.30 a.m. until further orders. The petitioner shall comply with the conditions stipulated under Section 438 Cr.P.C. scrupulously.

6.The petitioner shall appear before the concerned Magistrate within a period of 15 days from the date on which the order copy made ready, failing which, the petition for anticipatory bail shall stand dismissed.
