PRAYER: Contempt Petition filed under section 11 of the Contempt of Courts Act, to punish the respondents for their willful disobedience of the order passed by this Honourable Court in W.P(MD) No.22553 of 2015 dated 21.01.2016.

Prayer in WP(MD). 22553/ 2015 :

Writ Petition is filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, praying this Court to issue a Writ of Mandamus directing the Respondents to pay entire terminal benefits payable to the petitioner including Salary arrears in terms of settlement under section 12(3) of the Industrial Disputes Act dt.13.4.2015, Gratuity, the Commuted Value of Pension, Leave Salary with enhanced dearness allowance at the rate of 113% in terms of G.O.No.121 Finance(Allowances) Department dt.22.04.2015 and dearness allowance arrears on her monthly pension together with interest at the rate of 18% per annum from the date of his retirement to file the date of payment within the time that may be stipulated by this Hon'ble Court.

The contempt petition has been filed to commit and punish the respondents for their willful disobedience of the order passed by this Court in W.P.(MD)No.22553 of 2015, dated 21.01.2016.

2. Heard Mr.A.Rahul, learned counsel for the petitioner, Mr.D.Sivaraman, learned counsel for the first and second contemnors and Mr.A.P.Muthupandian, learned counsel for the third contemnor.

3. The petitioner claims that all the terminal benefits have already been paid to the petitioner. However, interest for commutation, leave salary and gratuity is not paid.

4. The learned counsel for the contemnors on instructions would submit that the amount due and payable if any shall be calculated and paid to the petitioner, within a period of two months from the date of receipt of a copy of this order. In case of non-compliance, the petitioner can revive the contempt petition.

5. Recording the above submission, this contempt petition is closed with liberty to the petitioner to revive the contempt petition in case of non-compliance. No costs.
