PRAYER: Contempt Petition filed under section 11 of the Contempt of Courts Act, to initiate contempt proceedings against the contemnors/respondents and punish him for the willful disobedience of the order of the Court in W.P.(MD)No.20993 of 2015 dated 26.11.2015.

Prayer in WP(MD)No.20993/2015 :

Writ Petition is filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India, praying this Court to issue a Writ of Mandamus directing the respondents to settle the retirement benefits of the petitioner including Gratuity, the Commuted Value of Pension, Social Security Scheme arrears Leave Salary with enhanced Dearness Allowance in terms of G.O.(Ms) No.121 Finance (Allowances) Department dated 22.04.2015 together with interest at the rate of 18% per annum from the date of his retirement to till date of settlement with in the time that may be stipulated by this Hon'ble Court and further directing the respondents to pay interest at the rate of 18% per annum for the belated payment of the provident fund and social security scheme arrears within the time limit that may be fixed by this Hon'ble Court.
