The contempt petition is filed for non-compliance of the order dated 31.08.2016 vide which a direction was issued to decide the representation of the petitioner in the light of the order passed in LPA No.352 of 2014 (State of Punjab and others versus A.P.Sharma and others). As per judgment rendered in A.P.Sharma's case (supra), the respondents were directed to verify the claim of each petitioner and if covered, consequential benefits be granted to them.

Learned counsel for the respondents has handed-over an order dated 03.05.2018 wherein it is stated that the rate of pension has been revised from Rs.8530/- to Rs.8613/- per month and the rate of family pension too has been revised which amounts to Rs.6090/- per month. It is further directed that arrears of pension too shall be disbursed to the petitioner w.e.f. 01.12.2011.

In view of the above, the contempt petition is disposed of.

Rule discharged.

In case the petitioner is still aggrieved or there is any

a fresh representation within three weeks from today and in case such a representation is filed within the stipulated period, the respondents shall consider and decide the same by way of a speaking order within four weeks of the receipt of such representation. The arrears of pension, as mentioned in the order dated 03.05.2018, be also disbursed forthwith, if not already paid.
