Petitioner (Joginder Singh), had filed criminal writ petition bearing *CRWP No.90 of 2016*, seeking directions to respondent No.2 therein to decide his representation dated 07.01.2016, which was disposed of by this Court vide order dated 20.01.2016 (**Annexure P-1**), with a direction '*to respondent No.2/Senior Superintendent of Police, Fazilka, Punjab to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in his representation dated 07.01.2016 and if some substance is found, to take appropriate action in accordance with law within a period of one month from the date of receipt of copy of the order*'.

Since the needful was not done within the prescribed time,

hence the present contempt petition.

Upon notice, a reply dated 31.03.2017 by way of short affidavit of Dr. Ketan Baliram Patial, IPS, Senior Superintendent of Police, Fazilka, on behalf of respondent, stands filed, wherein it is stated that in compliance of order dated 20.01.2016 (P-1), the representation of the petitioner dated 07.01.2016, has since been decided by the competent authority, i.e. SSP, Ferozepur, vide its report dated 22.03.2016 (Annexure R-1).

In view of above, learned State Counsel states that since the order dated 20.01.2016 (P-1) stands complied with, therefore, no further action in the present contempt is warranted, as the same has become infructuous.
