The petitioner-Society and others filed a writ petition bearing *CWP No.21964 of 2014*, claiming that the respondent-department has not been able to give the possession of the land described therein and purchased by them in an open auction and also not issued sales certificates inspite of the entire sales consideration having been paid to the Department. The said writ petition was *disposed of* vide order dated 29.10.2014 (**Annexure P-1**), directing the official respondents '*to take appropriate action for delivery of possession in accordance with law.*'

Upon notice, an affidavit dated 24.04.2017 was filed by Shri Tapan Bhanot, Tehsildar, Sultanpur Lodhi, as also subsequent additional

affidavit dated 25.10.2017 of Shri Gurmit Singh, Tehsildar, Sultanpur Lodhi, on behalf of respondent No.3 was filed.

From the perusal of the replies, it is evident that steps have been taken by the authorities to demarcate the land and handover the possession of the land in question to the petitioner/owners as also issue sales certificates in favour of the allottees.

Learned State Counsel submits that in view of the aforesaid steps taken, the directions stand complied with.

In view of the above, no further action is warranted in the present contempt petition.

Dismissed.
