JASWANT SINGH, J. (ORAL)

The petitioner-M/s R.V. Associates, Sangrur, alleges the violation of the order dated 07.11.2016 (**Annexure P-1**), passed in *CWP No.2298 of 2016*, whereby this Court, while disposing of the petition, had directed '*to the President, Municipal Council, Sangrur to consider the grievance raised by the petitioner vide its legal notice dated 21.04.2016, pointing out his grievances with regard to non-payment of his bills which he had submitted for the work he had carried out for the Municipal Council, Sangrur, by passing an appropriate order thereon, within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order. It was further*

directed that in case the petitioner is held entitled to the release of payment, the same was to be released without any loss of time.'

Upon notice, a reply on behalf of respondent No.2 stands filed, wherein in the stated that all the amount due towards the petitioner has been paid to him.

In view of the reply, learned counsel for the respondents states that nothing more survives in the present contempt petition, therefore, the same has become infructuous.

Disposed of as infructuous.

However, if there is in any inaccuracy in the stand of the respondents, the petitioner will free to seek revival of the present contempt petition within a period of two months from today.
