Petitioner-Sanjay Kumar had filed a writ petition bearing CWP No.20935 of 2016, challenging the order dated 04.11.2015 of the Deputy Commissioner, Rewari, whereby the 'No Objection Certificate' for retail outlet at Village Dahina, District Rewari had been refused to the petitioner while entertaining the complaint dated 08.04.2015 of one Narender Singh Yadav, Advocate. The said writ petition was allowed vide order dated 27.01.2017 (**Annexure P-1**), while setting aside the order dated 04.11.2015 of the Deputy Commissioner, Rewari and issued a direction for issuance of 'No Objection Certificate' for the establishment of retail outlet.

Since the NOC has not been granted to the petitioner, hence the present contempt petition.

Upon notice, a reply stands filed, wherein it is stated that the land is falling within the Forest Area and accordingly the Forest Department had asked the Indian Oil Corporation Limited to deposit the amended scheme and the requisite amount but till date amount has not been deposited by Indian Oil Corporation Limited.

In light of above, learned State counsel states that no willful disobedience of any order is made out.

In view of the reply as well as stand of the State counsel, the present petition is disposed of.

However, in case there is any factual error, petitioner is free to seek revival of the present contempt petition within two months from today.
