Short affidavit of the Director Secondary Education, Haryana, has been filed in Court, according to which the claim of the petitioners has been duly considered and a speaking order has been passed relying upon the orders dated 21.11.2017 (Annexure R-1). Even the arrears have been released to the petitioners, details of which are mentioned in Annexure R-2.

Counsel for the State, in the light of the above, submits that the present contempt petition has been rendered infructuous.

Rule issued to the respondent stands discharged.

In case the petitioners are still aggrieved by the action taken by the respondent or they have not been paid the due amount, they may approach the competent authority for redressal of the said grievance within a period of six weeks from today.

On doing so, let the said representation be considered and decided by the said authority by passing a speaking order.

In case the claim of the petitioners is accepted, the consequential benefits be released within a further period of eight weeks.
