Petitioner has filed the present Contempt under Section 10 & 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 for deliberately and intentionally disobeying the judgment dated 14.03.2016 (P-1) passed by this Court in CWP No.1949 of 2015 whereby respondent was directed to offer appointment as Training Officer (Mechanic Diesel Trade) to the petitioner within the 30 days from the passing of the order. Since the needful was not done, hence the present contempt petition.

At the time of hearing, learned State Counsel submits that the present contempt petition has become infructuous since the order passed by this Court has been fully complied with as is clear from para 5 of the short reply filed by way of affidavit of Director, Department of Technical

Education & Industrial Training, Punjab, Chandigarh.

aforesaid submission made on behalf of the respondent.

In view of the above, present contempt petition is hereby
disposed of as infructuous.
