AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASI, J. (ORAL)

Petitioner has approached this Court alleging violation of the order dated 02.05.2017 (Annexure P-1) passed by this Court in CRM-M-678-2017, titled as 'Harbinder Singh Vs. State of Punjab & others', preferred by the petitioner, when this Court had directed the Senior Superintendent of Police, Mohali, to ensure the peace and harmony between the petitioner and his brother and the life and liberty of the petitioner and his mother is duly protected, as also that of the petitioner's brother, who is living on the first floor of the house.

Counsel for the petitioner contends that the police authorities had removed one of the CCTV Cameras, which was installed by the petitioner forcefully and therefore, have violated the order passed by this Court on 02.05.2017 (Annexure P-1).

Reply has been filed by the respondents, wherein, they have stated that they have not removed any of the CCTV cameras.

Be that as it may, mere removal of the CCTV camera would not amount to violating the order dated 02.05.2017 passed by this Court as there was no such direction issued by this Court either to keep the CCTV camera intact or not to remove any of them from the premises. It goes without saying that the stand of the respondent is that they have not removed the CCTV camera.

In view the above, no violation of the order dated 02.05.2017 (Annexure P-1) is found by this Court and therefore, the present contempt petition stands dismissed.

Rule issued to the respondents stands discharged.
